

Be a Paramedic

Never wonder if you made a difference.

After becoming a licensed EMT, job opportunities await you. Work as an EMT while attending paramedic training. Enjoy the benefit of this advanced training without the need for costly student loans.

Emergency Medical Technician

EMT's respond to both emergency and non-emergency calls with patient transportation through an ambulance. The fundamental responsibility of an EMT is to transport and care for the medically ill or traumatically injured.

- 16-week training program
- \$1,400 (approx) - tuition, technology fee*
- 80% required course/final exam grade
- National Registry exam upon successful completion
- \$40 license fee
- 30 Continuing Education Units required every three years for license renewal
- Annual wages: \$30,000 - \$41,000 for 48-hour work week

Paramedic

Paramedics provide both basic and advanced life support, undergoing more advanced training. Paramedics are able to work in many health-care fields and pre-hospital services such as ambulance, fire safety or flight rescue.

- Prerequisite: State licensed EMT
- \$7,116.46 - tuition, books, technology fee**
- 15 month training course
- Work for MMR as an EMT while taking the course
- Reduced investment for advanced education - MMR paid tuition
- Student pays books and some testing fees
- 80% passing grade required for each quarter, plus externship

- Written and practical exams for National Registry
- \$80 license fee
- 45 Continuing Education Units every three years for license renewal
- Promotion opportunities to supervisory available
- Annual wages: \$43,500 - \$62,500 for 48-hour work week
- Leadership opportunities available for those with higher credentials.

Not interested in working in the field but still want to be a part of the action? A **Medical Communications Specialist** receives emergency calls by telephone, radio system or computer-aided dispatch system. They question callers to obtain the information needed to determine an appropriate course of action and level of resources necessary. Receive all required training after you are hired - no experience required. Annual wages range from \$30,500 - \$45,000 for 36- or 48-hour work week.
