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## **PLANNING**

We encourage schools to work with students prior to the event so that each is prepared to make the best of the event by determining their preferred career pathways and "must see" jobs.

However, we know there is a long list of demands placed on educators. In light of this, an education committee gathered to make suggestions regarding lessons to be completed prior to the event and following the event so you don't have to do the research yourselves.

The committee suggests that students have knowledge of their interests and skills prior to the event and possibly some exposure to careers that are in-demand. Following the event it is suggested to investigate career demand, careers, and businesses in the region. We hope that students also explore work-based learning experiences for careers they have interest in.

Resources from Xello, Career Cruising, Pathfinder and other sources are listed so districts have choices for lessons to explore depending upon what is available in your district. ## NOTES

Some employers and the event planning team will be using social media to promote the event, participating companies, and in-demand careers. Employers or event staff may suggest use of cell phones to gain access to information, promotion, or event surveys. The intent is for this to not detract from the hands-on focus of the event. We understand many districts may not allow technology use during the school day, but if your district will allow technology usage then please prep students for responsible use of technology. Ask students to treat requests by businesses and event staff as if it were an employer/employee relationship. If an employer asks an employee to use their phone for a specific application then it would be acceptable in the workplace to complete the assigned task using the device and then to put the device away.
